Our January speaker is John Schmitt, whose work has formed the major artistic contribution to over a dozen books, including the *National Geographic Field Guide to Birds* (4th edition) and the *Field Guide to Raptors of Europe, Middle East and North Africa*. John lives in the Kern River Valley and his artwork has graced publicity flyers and t-shirts for Audubon's Kern River Preserve Spring Festival for many years. Over two hundred of his illustrations have appeared in various ornithological journals, magazines, and environmental newsletters including American Birds, Continental Birdlife, and Western Birds. January Field Trips

Sun Jan 9, 3:00pm - Sandhill Cranes/Pixley Wildlife Refuge

Late afternoon and sunset are the best times to view the wintering Sandhill Cranes at Pixley Wildlife Refuge west of Earlimart. We will meet at the Rosdedale Costco in the parking area near the gas station to carpool. (This trip will be postponed in the event of rain and rescheduled to Sun. Jan. 30th, 3pm.) Contact field trip leader Madi Elsea (322-7470) for further information. If you haven't seen the cranes at sunset, it is a remarkable experience!

Sat. Jan. 22, 8:00am - Water Treatment Ponds (aka "stink ponds")

Join Michael McQuerry, one of Kern Audubon's great birders, for a morning watching & identifying waterfowl and shorebirds that frequent the City's water treatment plant at the end of Mt. Vernon south of Hiway 58. Meet at 8:00am at the gates to the facility. Follow Mt. Vernon Avenue south off Hiway 58 approximately 3 miles to the end. For more information call Roger Coley, 832-1820.

SANDHILL CRANES - A RETURN FIELD TRIP

Over 4,000 Sandhill Cranes winter in the southern San Joaquin Valley, feeding and foraging here from late October to early March. One of the areas they have chosen is Pixley Wildlife Refuge where hunting is not allowed. In late winter, the Cranes can be spotted doing their courtship dances preparatory to their northern migration and breeding. If you haven't had the opportunity to see the cranes, you can travel to Pixley NWR on your own or join Kern Audubon for a return trip on Sun. January 9th, 3:00pm, meeting at the Rosedale Costco near the gas station, returning after sunset. Look for folks with binoculars!



The refuge is located west of the community of Earlimart. Take Hiway 99 north to Earlimart and take Ave 56 exit and go west on Sierra Avenue, 5.7 miles. You can see the cranes until early March when they migrate north. For more information check the website:

MOUNTAIN PLOVER SURVEY

Audubon California is organizing a California-wide **Mountain Plover survey** this January 2011. This survey will help provide updated information on Mountain Plover winter abundance, geographic distribution and habitat associations in California. Volunteers are needed to help cover survey routes throughout Mountain Plover wintering areas in California.

The survey will take place over a five days, **January 20-24, 2011**. Participants will select predefined areas designed to be surveyed in half a day to a full day, and will conduct the survey on any day of their choosing during the five day survey period. Surveys will be largely vehicle based, where all accessible public roads are driven and suitable habitat is scanned for Mountain Plovers.

Qualifications: Ability and willingness to use your own vehicle and optics and enthusiasm for citizen-science projects. For more information or to sign up to participate, please contact Audubon California's
