





"On the Bluebird Trail: Tehachapi's Bluebird Recovery Project" Karen Pestana, Project Leader



Kern Audubon's Tehachapi sub-chapter has maintained and monitored a "Bluebird Trail" of Western Bluebird nest boxes for 13 years. The program reports its findings to the Cornell Lab of Ornithology's NestWatch program and in 2011 the Tehachapi bluebird trail team was recognized by Cornell as one of the "Top 20 NestWatch All Stars" for the number of nests monitored in 2011. The data collected is submitted to the online database in a continent-wide effort to better understand and manage the impacts of environmental change on bird populations. Karen Pestana's talk will give historical background on bluebird populations; outline the process of maintaining a monitoring program; and share results from these efforts to recover the species. Karen is a wildlife biologist with the Environmental Management Group at Edwards Air Force Base, where she is responsible for wildlife research, monitoring, and federal compliance programs for various species such as the Desert Tortoise. Karen has also coordinated and managed the Western Bluebird nest box monitoring program in the Tehachapi Mountains since it started in 1999.

- 4 boxes Ziploc freezer bags (qt or gal)
- 2 reams white copy paper
- Admission for 2 adults/2 children would be a \$25 gift certificate from any pet, grocery, hardware or office supply store.

BECOME A FEEDERWATCHER

Help learn about the habits of backyard birds by participating in Project FeederWatch. Anyone with an interest in birds and nature can participate in the project and become a "citizen scientist." The information you and others report online helps scientists at the Cornell Lab of Ornithology track changes in the numbers and distribution of birds across the continent.

"By watching and keeping track of the birds in your own neighborhood, you really can make a difference," says project leader David Bonter, "The more people watching, the more we can learn about the birds that brighten the winter landscape."
