SATURDAY DECEMBER 9th - Field Trip

Kern Nat'l Wildlife Refuge

7:30am - Meet at the Kern River Parkway parking lot across from CSUB

Scott Frazer, member of Kern Audubon and biologist at the Kern National Wildlife Refugee 45 miles north of Bakersfield, will be our field trip leader and will take us to parts of the refuge not normally seen by the public. Expect to see 40-50 species of waterfowl, shorebirds, songbirds, birds of prey, mammals, etc.!

Bring warm clothes, binoculars, water, snacks and a lunch. Scheduled return time will be 1:30pm. *In the event of heavy FOG, meet at the parking lot at 8:30am.* Contact *Te*d Murphy (325-0307) or Madi Elsea (322-7470) for information.

FOR THE BIRDS ...

One of the traditions long-associated with the Audubon Society is the annual Christmas Bird Count. Even older than Audubon itself, the CBC began in 1900 as an alternative to the traditional Christmas bird hunt, in which teams shot as many birds as possible. The first count included 27 people in 25 locations, but they were armed with pencils and binoculars! The CBC is the oldest bird census in the world with over 50,000 volunteers in 2000 locations, providing one of the most important bodies of information on wildlife data in the world. Leading two of the Kern County counts birding experts, John Wilson & Alison Sheehy. Two dates are scheduled (see p. 3) and volunteers are needed for both days. This is not your average field trip...experienced birders are especially needed and an all-day commitment. Contact John or Alison for information and consider participating...

JULY 7TH SUMMER BIRD COUNT

In early July, from 1999 - 2002, a South Fork Kern River Valley Rapid Assessment Summer Bird Count was conducted. Participants included a "Who's Who" of California and some out of state birders, particularly in association with the July, 2000 Western Field Ornithologists's Annual Meeting centered in Kernville.

The original concept was to conduct a rapid assessment count every five years in this, one of California's great remaining cottonwood/willow riparian forests. So... a five-years-later count is set for Saturday, July 7, 2007. Mark your calendars now and plan to participate next July 7th (with follow-up birding opportunities that Saturday afternoon and the next day, Sunday). Please mark your calendars now! Plans are for follow-up e-mails in March and May.

Literally thousands of new acres of land have been protected in the South Fork Valley since 2002. This count will provide access to much of this new land and to other areas otherwise off-limits to birders. The chance will be present to have a fun day of birding while producing meaningful data from birding both the areas censused in the past and vast new areas. Audubon chapter and bird club groups are welcome. There are plenty of acres (10,000+) to go around.
