Geographic Field Guide to Birds of Colorado and the Cornell Lab of Ornithology Bird Songs of California and are seen regularly in Birding and Birder's World magazines. His collection of images includes over 500 species of birds, habitat photos and images of local flowers, butterflies and dragonflies. In 2007 Bob spent six weeks summer birding and photographing in northeast Australia where he saw over 300 species of birds and photographed 200 species. MARCH FIELD TRIPS

<u>Saturday, March 15 - Kern Water Bank</u> Trip leader will be Cheryl Harding, manager of the Kern Water Bank Authority. Meet at the parking lot on Stockdale Highway across from CSUB at 7:20 a.m. for a <u>7:30 departure</u>, and carpooling to the Water Bank. Or meet the group at the green Water Bank gates on the west side of Enos Lane south of Stockdale Hiway at 8:00 a.m. (The gates are located just north of where Enos Lane crosses the Water Bank canal, north of the bridge crossing the Kern River.) There will be water in the canals, and because of recent rains the countryside should be green and there may be wildflowers. The trip will be mostly driving and we will be CARPOOLING while on the Water Bank, completing the field trip before noon. There may be some walking on level ground. Bring water, snacks, sunscreen, insect repellant, and binoculars. For more information, call Roger at 832-1820.

<u>Saturday, March 29 - BLM's Atwell Island Restoration Project.</u> Trip leader will be Dr. Steve Laymon, Atwell Island Project Manager. Meet at 6:50 a.m. in the Costco parking lot on Rosedale Highway (behind Hungry Hunter) near the gas pumps, for <u>7:00 a.m. departure</u>. Or meet the group at 8:00 a.m. at the BLM office in Alpaugh (at the 4-way stop sign intersection of Ave. 54 & Tule Rd, go south on Tule Rd. [it becomes Rd. 38] approx. 1-1/2 miles; the BLM office is on the west side of Rd. 38). The trip should last until early afternoon. Now in its fifth year, this Bureau of Land Management project is restoring 7000 acres of valley grassland and alkali sink beds; we will tour restored habitat, home to several listed and sensitive species. Bring water, snacks & lunch, sunscreen, insect repellant and binoculars. For more information, call Roger at 832-1820.

March 5th--National Audubon Society is urging members to put this date on our calendars and plan on joining thousands of other concerned citizens by calling on the US House of Representatives to pass the Clean Water Restoration Act. This legislation is vital to restoring the broad coverage of the Clean Water Act of 1972 by clarifying that it applies to ALL of the nation's waters, including fragile wetlands and streams.

Kern River Valley Spring Nature Festival April 30 - May 6, 2008

You are invited to the Kern River Valley Spring Nature Festival, April 30 - May 6, 2008, held annually at Audubon's Kern River Preserve in Weldon and Circle Park in Kernville! This festival celebrates the biodiversity of the Kern River Valley and Southern Sierra Nevada. home to over 200 nesting species of birds, 100 species of mammals, 130+ species of butterflies, and over 2000 species of plants. This great diversity comes from being at the intersection of three of North America's ten Floristic Provinces (Great Basin Desert Province, Mojave Desert subprovince of the Sonoran Desert Province, and Californian Province).

This year, festival artist, John Schmitt, will present a new t-shirt design featuring "Spring Warblers of the Kern River Valley and Southern Sierra Nevada". Friday night keynote speaker will be photograhper Bob Steele (www.bobsteelephoto.com), who will give a presentation on "Warblers: nesting, migrant, and vagrant of the Kern River Valley and Southern Sierra Nevada, plus bonus regional specialty birds". Saturday night's keynoter will be John Muir Laws (www.johnmuirlaws.com) who will give a presentation on "An Evening Exploring the Natural World of the Sierra Nevada". Bob will give workshops on photography on Saturday and John will offer workshops on painting nature and will be available to autograph his book, *The Laws Field Guide to the Sierra Nevada*.

There are 30 different field trip choices featuring birding, wildflower, geology, natural history and butterflies. Weekend workshops are offered on bird photography; gardening with native plants; Native American uses of plants; how to draw nature; bird, reptile, amphibian, and plant identification; and more, plus demonstrations on bird banding, pond turtles and falconry.

Many field trip destinations are offered all seven days, with half-day field trips offered Saturday and Sunday. In addition to our traditional field trips, new offerings for the festival are new owling destinations, Little Lake/Owens Lake, and Frog Spring/Kelso Creek Sanctuary. Field trip sign-ups are now open but several sections for specific days have already sold out...so sign-up early!

Except for the paid field trips, workshops and dinners, the rest of the festival activities are free and sponsored by Audubon California's Kern River Preserve, Bob Barnes and Associates, Kern River Valley Revitalization and Sequoia National Forest.
