KERN AUDUBON SOCIETY Tues.. March 5, 2013 - 7:00PM Kern Supt of Schools - 17th & L Sts. (Parking garage 18th & K Sts.) "Partnerships Protect California Natives: Dairy Farms and Tricolored Blackbirds" Keiller Kyle, Audubon CA

Audubon California has been involved with Tricolored Blackbird conservation for the past decade, but recently, has begun to develop new methods to protect this species of special concern, which nests in large colonies. Audubon CA's Tricolored Blackbird Conservation Director, KEILLER KYLE, has been engaging Central Valley farmers and wetland managers in developing co-beneficial management of farm fields and marshes that protect breeding Tricolored Blackbird colonies and food resources they rely on. Last



year was an eventful one with 20% of the global population of Tricolored Blackbirds being protected through a USDA program developed for Tricolors nesting in crop fields. Kyle will be detailing current Tricolor conservation work being done by Audubon and numerous partners, the successes and opportunities for future work with this personable and fascinating colonial breeder in the San Joaquin Valley.

Keiller Kyle joined Audubon California two year ago and has been working extensively with the dairy industry and individual dairymen to establish on-farm wildlife habitat that benefits birds as well as improves water quality and pest control. He grew up on a dairy farm in Central New York, received his Master's in Ecology from Purdue University and had also done extensive avian fieldwork prior to joining Audubon California in 2010.

MARCH FIELD TRIPS

Flowing Wells Ranch is a private farming and wildlife management operation located in the Mojave Desert near Cantil and Red Rock State Park. Rancho De Nada is an adjacent ranch. This is a great location to see waterfowl, raptors, Great Horned Owls, and the occasional rarity. Since Flowing Wells and Rancho De Nada are private access to this area is limited. KERN RIVER PRESERVE

Audubon California's Kern River Preserve along the South Fork Kern River is implementing the first phase of a three year restoration project funded by the NRCS Wetland Reserve Program and USFWS Partners for Wildlife Program. We will be planting native shrubs, grasses and trees on 24 acres of formerly cultivated floodplain along the South Fork Kern River. The goal is to enhance habitat for a variety of wildlife species such as San Emigdio Blue butterfly, Loggerhead Shrike, Summer Tanager and Southwestern Pond Turtle.
