# "Tejon Ranch Conservancy: Providing Access to this Historic Property" Scot Pipkin, Public Access Coordinator



With a mandate to provide significant public access to the conserved lands of Tejon Ranch, the Conservancy is working to develop a diverse array of opportunities. Currently, we are focusing our efforts on cultivating a robust corps of volunteers to help lead trips, gather scientific data, and assist with stewardship projects. The ultimate goal is to have a public access program where visitors to Tejon Ranch can observe and participate in leading-edge conservation work on one of the most superlative properties in the state.

Scot Pipkin is the Public Access Coordinator for Tejon Ranch Conservancy. A native of southern California, Scot has worked throughout the state as a naturalist and outdoor guide. He began birding while living in Tucson, Arizona and working for the National Park Service and US Forest Service both in southern Arizona and New Mexico. Scot has led several of our field trips to the ranch and has a heart for birds!

#### **NOVEMBER FIELD TRIPS**

#### Sat. November 8 - Atwell Island & "Return of the Cranes" Festival

This promises to be a great afternoon & evening of birding in southern Tulare County. We will meet at <a href="mailto:12:30pm">12:30pm</a> at the Costco on Rosedale near the gas station to carpool. Eat lunch before you come and bring a SACK DINNER, snacks & water, binoculars and jackets for the evening. After birding at Atwell Island (a Bureau of Land Management restoration project near Alpaugh), we will head to Pixley National Wildlife Refuge for the "Return of the Sandhill Cranes Festival" starting at 4:00pm, hosted by NWR staff. There will be a 1/2 mile walk to the observation deck at sunset, which is the best time to see the Sandhill Cranes as they fly back to the protection of the refuge for the night. Bring flashlights! Carpoolers are asked to donate \$10 for drivers.

Those wishing to only attend the Sandhill Crane event can meet at Pixley NWR at 4pm. It's a 45 minute drive from Bakersfield to Earlimart via Hiway 99. Go west at Avenue 56 approx 5.7 miles to sign to refuge. Turn right & north 1 mile Contact Bill Moffat (201-9279) or Deb See (805-0232) for more information

#### Sat. Nov. 8th, 7:30am - Brite Lake, Tehachapi

Brite Lake hosts many migrating or wintering duck and shorebird species as well as grebe & heron species. Upland and wooded areas should also host migrating and wintering song birds. Migrating warblers, Red-shouldered hawks, loons, and Bald Eagles are also possible. Meet at the K Mart parking lot on Tehachapi Blvd. near Burger King at **7:30** am to carpool from there. RSVP to Angela Guy at angelaguy@att.net or 304-6816. Dress in layers and bring water, snacks, lunch, binoculars. If you have a spotting scope you should bring that as well.

#### TREE PLANTING AT PANORAMA VISTA PRESERVE

On Wednesday, October 15, Kern Audubon members participated in the initial planting of new shrubs and trees at the western extension of the Preserve. The event attracted volunteers from a variety of organizations and was funded, in part, by a generous contribution from PG&E (see photo below). Hundreds of more plants are ready for future planting events. This extension of the Preserve is possible through the cooperation of an adjoining property owner to share water from his well. Since all of the new plants came from native stock, in years to come, the view from the Panorama Bluffs will be one of a native forest, reminiscent of what earlier settlers like Thomas Baker viewed. Many thanks to Bill Cooper, Al Caetano, David Schaad, Andy Honig, Sasha Honig, Clyde Golden, and Harry Love! There will be more plantings, so please plan to come out & help!

#### ALL BIRDS WILL REJOICE!

Plastic bags washing up on the beach! Plastic bags blown against fences and building! Yuck! This ugly sight will soon disappear in California due to the first state-wide ban on single use plastic bags. Many communities in California, including San Luis Obispo County, have already passed ordinances prohibiting the use of these bags. The law first targets large grocery



stores and supermarkets (the largest users) with annual sales of two million dollars or more. The first phase of the law begins July 1, 2015. Small retail business must comply beginning in 2016. The law encourages businesses to sell reusable plastic film bags. However, be prepared for an effort to place this topic as a proposition on a future ballot. If this happens, you get to reaffirm this protection of birds at the ballot box. For more information go to: www.cawrecycles.org
